

What Veterans Need to Know:

- Bladder cancer is strongly linked to cigarette smoking
- Chemical exposures, such as Agent Orange, may also increase a Veteran's risk for bladder cancer
- Bladder cancer affects both men and women, but men are at greater risk

As of 2021, VA has diagnosed more than **67K** cases of bladder cancer in Veterans



IDENTIFYING BLADDER CANCER EARLY CAN SAVE YOUR LIFE

If you see blood in your urine, ask your provider to rule out bladder cancer

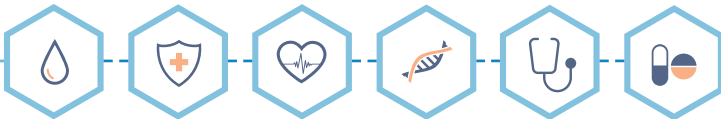
Other signs and symptoms of bladder cancer may include:
